## AWARDS PROGRAM

The Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) - Aloha Chapter sponsors an annual awards program to recognize outstanding achievement by individuals, corporate and small business philanthropists, as well as fundraising volunteers and fundraising professionals. Such individuals and organizations form a vital philanthropic partnership that sustains our communities.

These philanthropy awards are given in recognition of those individuals and organizations whose lifetime or long-term achievements have had a significant impact in Hawai'i.

## HISTORY OF THE NOMINATION PROCESS

In the past, the nomination process required five copies of a ten page nomination packet to be submitted for each candidate. Starting in 2003, AFP implemented an online nomination process to provide nominators with a more efficient nomination and accountable scoring process. In 2003 & 2004, the pilot of the online nomination process accepted either the hardcopy or electronic format of the nomination forms. Each year AFP aims to improve the nomination process.

## WHY ONLY ONLINE NOMINATION APPLICATIONS?

Starting this year, with improved features of the online nomination tool, **only online nominations will be accepted.** This provides more AFP funds for conference scholarships and eliminates laborious paperwork replication and scoring errors for the judging panel.

The online application provide nominators with the ability to share the draft application with other associates as well as edit applications with a user name and password as many times as desired until the deadline date. The AFP Aloha Chapter office will provide assistance to nominators who need help to use the online nomination form.

**Hard copy nominations will NOT be accepted this year.**

## NOMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

To nominate candidates, please visit the AFP website at [www.afphawaii.org](http://www.afphawaii.org) and follow the specific instructions for each type of application. You may submit nominations in as many categories as you wish. Please obtain the consent of the nominee prior to submitting the nomination. You may resubmit nominations from past years if your nominee has not yet been honored with an award.

A completed nomination packet will include the following:

1. The Nomination Form
2. Narrative summary (500 word max)
3. Up to three optional supporting documents (letters of support, news clippings) in pdf, Microsoft Word, jpg, tiff format. Individual files over 500KB will not be accepted.
4. Criteria questions (see criteria details per award division).

**Nominations must be submitted by  
5:00 p.m. on August 1, 2005**

## SELECTION CRITERIA

Criteria for each award are listed with the nominating instructions. Complete information is essential for consideration. A panel of community leaders serving as judges will make the final selection for each award.

## PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

All nominators and honorees will be advised of the outcome of the judging. The honorees selected will be notified in early Fall and will receive their awards and special recognition at AFP's National Philanthropy Day luncheon on November 18, 2005. Please plan to attend the event to celebrate philanthropy in Hawai'i.

## Outstanding Philanthropist Award 2005

Please provide a summary narrative, not to exceed 500 words, addressing the following five criteria. Supporting documents, such as news clippings and letters of recommendation, are accepted, but should only enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. A maximum of three supporting documents may be attached, but only at the time of the original submission of the nomination. No videos will be accepted.

1. Evidence of personal financial resources given in support of projects in the community, nationally and/or internationally. (0-30 points)
2. Description of impact of gift support on above projects. (0-20 points)
3. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given others to take leadership roles toward philanthropy and community involvement. (0-20 points)
4. Description of leadership in securing gifts from others for support of nonprofit organizations in the community, nationally, and/or internationally. (0-20 points)
5. Evidence of broad scope of giving and length of giving history. (0-10 points)

## Outstanding Volunteer Fundraiser Award 2005

Please provide a summary narrative, not to exceed 500 words, addressing the following five criteria. Supporting documents, such as news clippings and letters of recommendation, are accepted, but should only enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. A maximum of three supporting documents may be attached, but only at the time of the original submission of the nomination. No videos will be accepted.

1. Evidence of quality of leadership and organizational ability in fundraising campaigns. (0-25 points)
2. Description of time, effort, and financial commitment volunteered to philanthropic activities. (0-25 points)
3. Description of fundraising goals achieved by his/her effort. (0-15 points)
4. Evidence of success in recruiting and motivating others. (0-20 points)
5. Description of participation in other local, national, or international nonprofit organizations. (0-15 points)

## Outstanding Fundraising Professional Award 2005

Please provide a summary narrative, not to exceed 500 words, addressing the following five criteria. Supporting documents, such as news clippings and letters of recommendation, are accepted, but should only enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. A maximum of three supporting documents may be attached, but only at the time of the original submission of the nomination. No videos will be accepted.

1. Description of career achievements: length and tenure of fund raising background, experience, and results. (Recipient should have at least five years of professional fund raising experience). (0-25 points)
2. Evidence of quality of leadership that is effective, creative, and stimulating, and evidence that the individual acts as a team player. (0-25 points)
3. Evidence that the nominee practices and promotes sound and ethical principles, following the AFP Code of Ethical Principles & Standards of Professional Practice for fund raising professionals. (0-15 points)
4. Description of individual's commitment to continuing professional development, conference participation, publication and professional education. (0-15 points)
5. Evidence of commitment to this profession and to philanthropy through voluntary service and support of other professionals and nonprofit organizations. (0-20 points)

## Outstanding Corporation Award 2005 (Company with 100+ employees)

Please provide a summary narrative, not to exceed 500 words, addressing the following five criteria. Supporting documents, such as news clippings and letters of recommendation, are accepted, but should only enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. A maximum of three supporting documents may be attached, but only at the time of the original submission of the nomination. No videos will be accepted.

1. Evidence of financial support of philanthropic projects in the community, nationally and/or internationally. (0-25 points)
2. Description of impact of gift support on above projects. (0-25 points)
3. Description of in-kind contributions to charitable causes, such as loaned executives, marketing and advertising support, and the impact of such contributions (0-20 points)
4. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given employees and others to take leadership roles toward philanthropy and community involvement. (0-20 points)
5. Evidence of support for creative or innovative approaches to community issues. (0-10 points)

## **Outstanding Small Business Award 2004** **(Company with fewer than 100 employees)**

Please provide a summary narrative, not to exceed 500 words, addressing the following five criteria. Supporting documents, such as news clippings and letters of recommendation, are accepted, but should only enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. A maximum of three supporting documents may be attached, but only at the time of the original submission of the nomination. No videos will be accepted.

1. Evidence of support of philanthropic projects in the community, nationally and/or internationally (0-25 points)
2. Description of impact of gift support on above projects (0-25 points)
3. Description of in-kind contributions to charitable causes, such as loaned executives, marketing and advertising support, and the impact of such contributions (0-20 points)
4. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given employees and others to take leadership roles in philanthropy and community involvement (0-20 points)
5. Evidence of support for creative or innovative approaches to community issues (0-10 points)
